



Hatch has the unique perspective in this that we see so many different Community Social Responsibility and Environmental Projects Globally.


 Motivation for CSR Projects to the company is always driven by long term view and risk reduction in reaching successful project. This includes economic view.

- Connect 17 remote First Nations communities for the first time
- 22 First Nations have partnered to take 51 per cent stake, Fortis holding remaining
- \$1.5 billion project
- 10 years to make this a reality
- 1,800 kilometres of transmission lines and 21 substations
- Delivery of relatively small amount of power over such a vast distance
- Design to allow for future expansion
 - One-third of the 800-person work force will be First Nations



Nunatsiavut Group of Companies

- In Newfoundland and Labrador Hatch has worked with the Nunatsiavut Group of Companies
- Collectively, the two organizations delivered stakeholder engagement, training and capacity building of local Innu workers on the Northern Labrador Project.





Mary River Project

- In Baffin Island, Nunavut, Hatch is working closely with the Mary River Project to provide hands on support to Inuit entrepreneurs and small business owners.
- This support includes developing a guide detailing how to bid for work on the project, face-to-face meetings with Inuit firm owners to discuss the bidding process and providing data collection and reporting tools for Inuit Firms.
